

Investing for Success

Under this agreement for 2018 Innisfail State School will receive

\$137,928*

This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of Prep students achieving PM 9 from 26.9% in 2017 to 60% in Year 1 in 2018
- Increase the percentage of Year 1 students achieving PM19 from 20.6% in 2017 to 60% in Year 2 in 2018
- Increase the percentage of Year 2 students achieving PM25 from 60% in 2017 to 90% in Year 3 in 2018
- Increase the percentage of Year 3 students achieving NMS in reading from 92% in 2017 to 100% in 2018
- Increase the percentage of Year 5 students achieving NMS in reading from 81.8% in 2017 to 100% in 2018
- Increase the percentage of Year 3 students achieving in the U2B in reading from 20% in 2017 to 25% in 2018
- Increase the percentage of Year 5 students achieving in the U2B in reading from 4.5% in 2017 to 15% in 2018
- Increase the percentage of P – 2 students A- E data in English from 49% in 2017 to 70% in Year 1 – 3 in 2018
- Increase the percentage of speech goals achieved to 70% for students receiving speech intervention
- Collaborate with parents to improve outcomes for students speech goals and provide home speech programs

Our initiatives include

- Build teacher capacity in research based pedagogically practices and consolidations through coaching, feedback and lesson observation
- Collaboratively plan and analyse data fortnightly within cohort meetings
- Case manage all students with 5 weekly data collection and analysis including setting SMART goals for targeted students
- Implement additional intensive researched based intervention support programs in reading and oral language for identified students
- Targeting reading and writing intervention (Getting kids writing one sentence at a time) to students in years 1 – 5 where achievement is below year level cohort students
- Engage parents as partners in the school community to improve students outcomes
- Individually case manage P – 3 students with attendance below 95%

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employing a Head of Curriculum to lead staff and build capacity in the schools learning support and intervention and deliver individualised support plans for students (\$115 000)
- Employ support staff to provide personalised speech language programs for students in years 1 – 3 (\$22 000)

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
